We can safely say this fall was very full and rate it as fantastic.

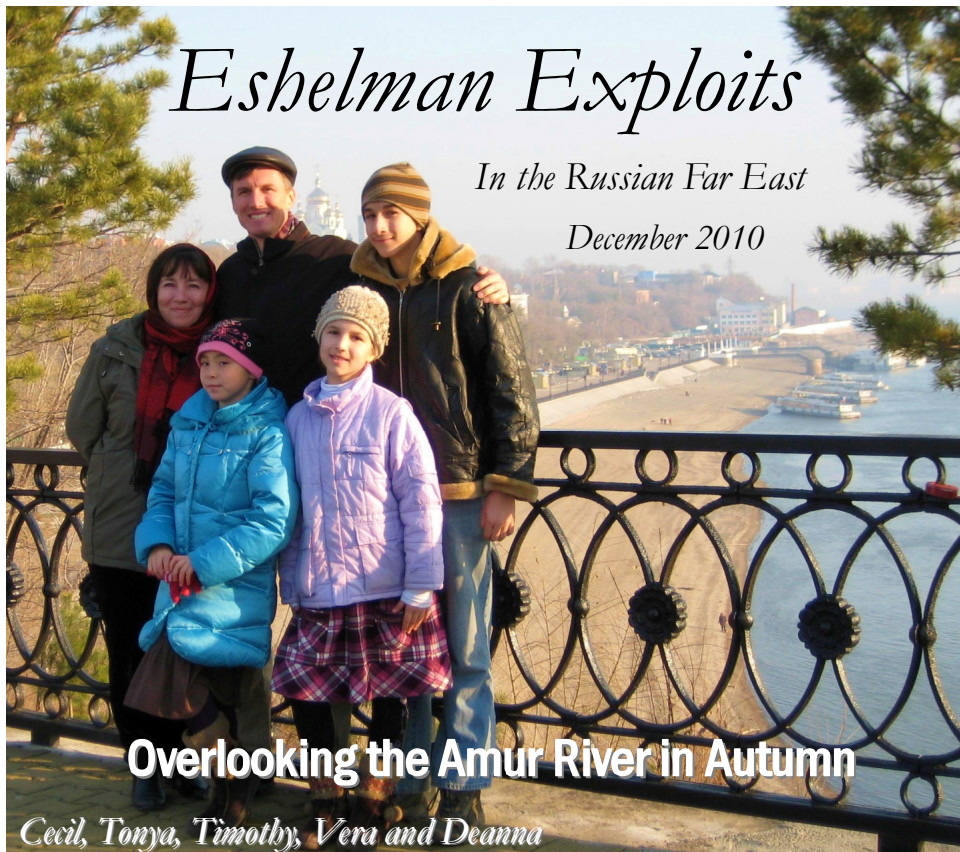

We've been hosting birthday parties and forming relationships. We've been hoping to start life skills classes, but couldn't locate an appropriate curriculum until just recently (we had to send a Russian co-worker for training in Kiev to get the material). Now we need more co-workers to help teach the classes.

Every Thursday night we show movies at youth. Our goal is to keep in touch with the orphanages, since it can be hard for us to find them. Of course, anyone can come. If you have any good, wholesome, and preferably evangelistic movies in the RUSSIAN language, please let us know.

We brought in a small team who spent a week in a Nanian village north of us. They lived in a church building while they taught, listened, and fellowshiped with the locals. So now we've formed a good starting connection with this people group.

We've also continued to assist Open Heart homeless shelter. Their ministry continues to expand, and with winter more people will be seeking their assistance. Soon they will need more land to build on. We've seen more healings and changed lives there than in with any other ministry we've ever worked with.

There are so many doors of ministry open here that we can't even begin to go through them all. The greatest need we have is for more workers. Thankfully, God answers prayers, and the Hinson family has come to Khabarovsk. They plan to live in Russia for long term work. Right now they are busy learning the Russian language, settling in to a new place, and preparing to have their fourth child.
